Biographical Note

Clifton Edwards was born on August 11, 1898 in Christoval, Texas. Edward's first trip to Payson was in 1909 searching for his father who had taken a job working on the Roosevelt Dam and then moved on to Payson and began working for Dr. Risser taking care of his cattle. From 1909 until 1923 Edwards worked all over Gila County and earned the nickname "Tuffie" for his exploits in the rodeos. In 1923 he learned to fly and eventually his nickname was changed to "Tailspin". Edwards flew into Payson in 1927, the first time an airplane had ever landed in Payson. Edwards was a flight instructor for the Army Air Corp during WWII. Edwards did not return to Gila County until the 1960's, when he took up cowboying again. Edwards lived one month, three days past 100, dying on September 14, 1998 in Casa Grande, Arizona. He is buried in the Payson Pioneer Cemetery, where he had owned a plot for 80 years.
